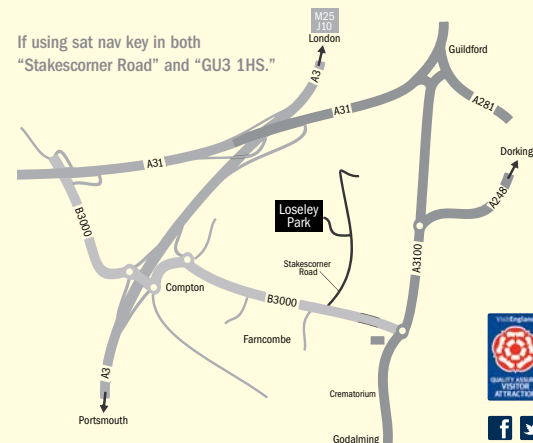

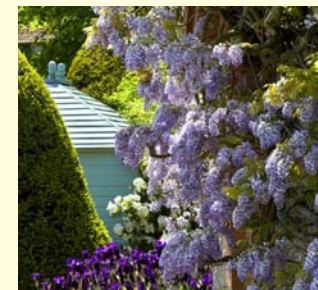

Loseley Park has been my family's home for over five hundred years and four generations live here today – my wife Sophia with our children Cressida, twins Aubrey and Rocco and Zsa Zsa, my parents Michael and Sarah, my grandmother Susan and my brother Tristram. We continue to remember my beloved brother Christopher (1985 - 1997).

Hospitality is a family tradition and we take pride in opening our estate, house and gardens to visitors as well as for weddings, corporate events, country fairs and artisan shows.

Loseley House is situated only a short distance from London in acres of rolling parkland with views that have changed very little in five hundred years. Our ancestor Sir William More built the house in 1562 at the request of Elizabeth I who stayed on four different occasions. James I and Queen Anne of Denmark, also stayed for one night. The house is a fine example of Elizabethan architecture featuring many fine works of art. Loseley was built as a family home and it still remains so.

the house & grounds

The guided tours of Loseley House cover a multitude of fascinating artefacts, including many fine works of art, furniture from the 17th century and unique features such as the panelling from Henry VIII's Nonsuch Palace and the magnificent chalk fireplace. You will also learn about the More-Molyneux family, its connections with royalty and other great characters in history, and you will experience the renowned tranquillity and atmosphere which comes from a House lived in by the same family for five centuries. Visitors are welcome to wander in the area around the House and Gardens or take a stroll down the chestnut avenue, planted by my mother, to the lake. The chapel is usually open for peace and private prayer.

the walled garden

The two and a half acre Walled Garden is one that surprises and delights the visitor. It has been compared by visitors to gardens of national renown, and its series of "rooms" include the award winning Rose Garden, the White Garden, the fascinating Herb Garden and the Organic Vegetable Garden.

Other features include the magnificent Vine Walk and the delightful Flower Garden, while the ancient mulberry tree – a potent symbol of the family's fortunes for centuries – lies close to the picturesque Moat Walk.

Delicious light lunches, cream teas and other refreshments are served in our Tea Room within the Walled Garden. Closed on Fridays and Saturdays.
